		X		9-11	<u>FERN</u>	Foxtail (Annual)	Deep green, tapered foxtail-like spikes
		X		9-11	<u>FERN</u>	Kimberly Queen (Annual)	(36") straight and narrow upright but gracefully arching leaves
		X		10	<u>FERN</u>	Macho (Annual)	This fern has fronds 8" wide and 4 feet long, fabulous in hanging baskets
	X			3-10	<u>BOUTELOUA</u>	Blonde Ambition	(12"-24") chartreuse flowers mature to blonde seedheads stiff spines over blue-green foliage
X				4	<u>CALAMAGROSTIS</u>	Avalanche	48-60x60 white leafed centers with narrow green margins, silvery-tan plumes
X				4-9	<u>CALAMAGROSTIS</u>	Karl Forester	18-24"x2-3' pink plumes in spring matures to tan
X				4-10	<u>CALAMAGROSTIS</u>	Lightning Strike	(36") broad central stripes of creamy white edged in green
X				5-11	<u>CALAMAGROSTIS</u>	Overdam	48-60x60" striped, green and white foliage, silvery bronze flowers
				5-9	<u>CAREX</u>	Evercolor Everillo	(12") lime green foliage that changes to bright golden yellow with more sun
X				5-9	<u>ERIANTHUS</u>	Ravennae (Plume)	10-14" plumes over 5' hardy foliage, very eye catching!
				4-8	<u>FESTUCA</u>	Beyond Blue	(9"-12") mound shape about 18" wide; stays blue tends not to "brown out", light brown bloom
				6-11	<u>LIRIOPE</u>	Spicata	(10-12") tolerates heat, drought, and heavy shade; spike like clusters of pale violet to white flowers; can be invasive
	X			5-10	<u>MISCANTHUS</u>	Bandwidth	(2'-3') broad bright gold bands; rich green blade; forms full compact stand of grass
X				5-10	<u>MISCANTHUS</u>	Cabaret	(9") ultra-wide blades; creamy white centers and dark green margins
X				5-9	<u>MISCANTHUS</u>	Gold Breeze	(5-7") shades of gold and a silvery tassel; excellent as a specimen or backdrop plant
X				5-9	<u>MISCANTHUS</u>	Gracillimus	(5-7") feathery, fan shaped, pale pink panicles, neat narrow-leaved upright.
	X			8-10	<u>MUHLENBERGIA</u>	Dumosa (Annual)	NEW (48") fine pale green leaves on arching stems resemble bamboo stalks
	X			4-10	<u>PANICUM</u>	Heavy Metal	(5') glaucous blue leaves; strong upright form; delicate seed heads;
X				4-9	<u>PANICUM</u>	Red Flame	NEW (3-3.5') blue-green foliage turns wine red by the end of the summer
X				4	<u>PANICUM</u>	Shenandoah	(40-48") often mistaken for blood grass, tips of blades red in the spring then deep burgundy in fall
	X			9-10	<u>PENNISETUM</u>	Fireworks (Annual)	(24-30") showy upright foliage of white, green and burgundy stripes; purple tassels in late summer
	X			8-11	<u>PENNISETUM</u>	First Knight (Annual)	(48"-54") deep dark black; upright leaves in center, arching at the edges
X				5-9	<u>PENNISETUM</u>	Hameln (Dwarf Fountain)	(24") dwarf hardy flowering version of setaceum, buff colored blooms in late summer
	X			5-9	<u>PENNISETUM</u>	Karley Rose	(24"-36") tall deep green arching foliage; rose pink flowers
	X			8-11	<u>PENNISETUM</u>	Red Riding Hood (Annual)	(12") perfect for containers and smaller borders; rich burgundy leaves, stems and plumes
	X			9-11	<u>PENNISETUM</u>	Rubrum (Annual)	12-36" upright arching, soft purple plumes from deep burgundy foliage, needs to be 55 degrees to grow

	X			3-9	<u>SCHIZACHYRIUM</u>	Blue Heaven	(3.5-4.5') bright steel blue foliage with purple highlights; turns purple, red, pink and orange in the fall
	X			3-10	<u>SCHIZACHYRIUM</u>	Chameleon	(12-24") foliage emerging green and white in spring adding pink and purple highlight in late summer
	X			3-9	<u>SCHIZACHYRIUM</u>	Twilight Zone	(48"-54") upright clump; iridescent silver mauve-purple mid summer; bright purple highlights in fall
				5-9	<u>SISYRINCHIUM</u>	Blue Eyed Grass	(10"-12") compact semi-evergreen narrow grass-like foliage; star-shaped blue flowers
